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Evidence shows that sanitation has an ROI

Investing in sanitation infrastructure is also about economic prosperity for Caribbean nations dependent on tourism.

Case Study: Bridgetown

Upgrading the Bridgetown Sewage Treatment Works generated economic NPV benefits of nearly **US\$ 600 million** from tourism.

Jobs at Risk

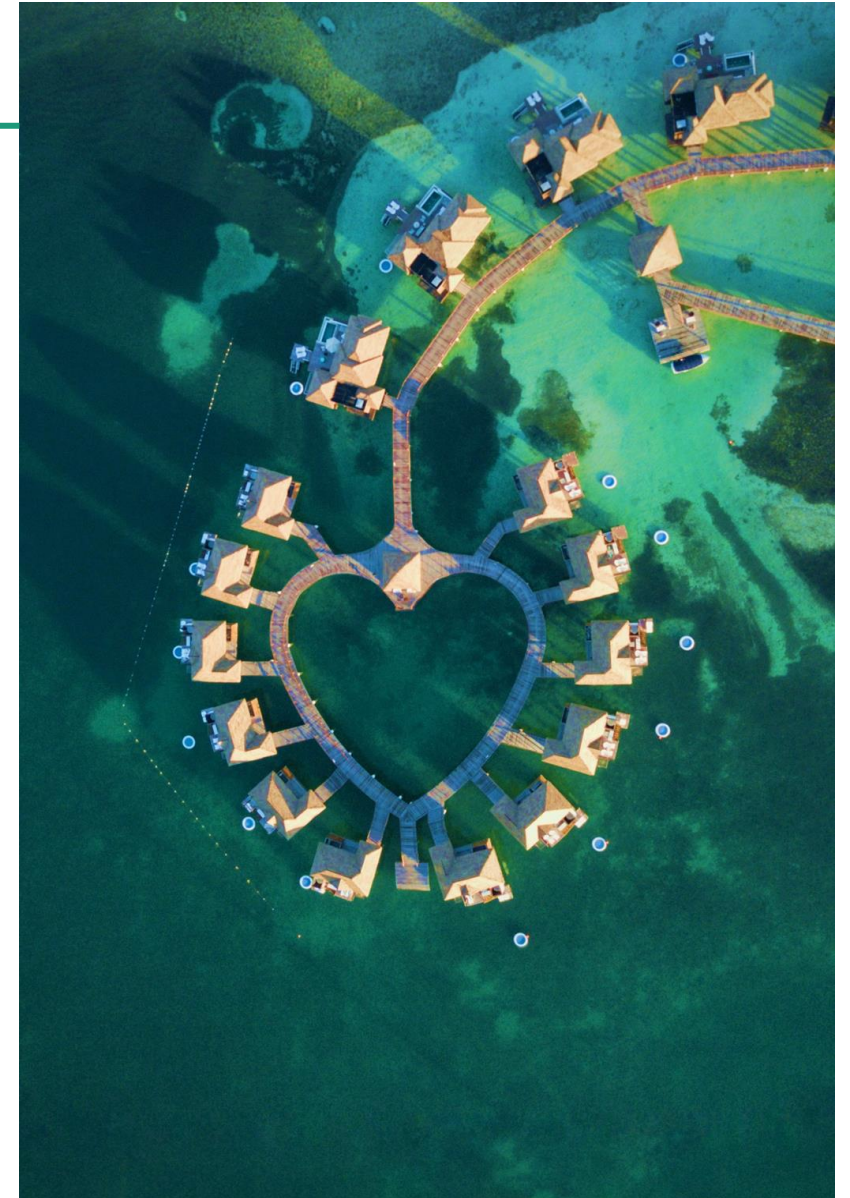
Approximately **2.75 million tourism jobs** across the Caribbean depend on pristine beaches, healthy coral reef & thriving fisheries.

Protecting Key Resources

Protecting **water resources & marine environments** through improved sanitation is essential for sustaining Caribbean economies.

The Sanitation Economy

A robust **sanitation marketplace** of products & services, renewable resource flows & data could transform Caribbean communities & businesses.

Countries conducted self-assessments across five pillars

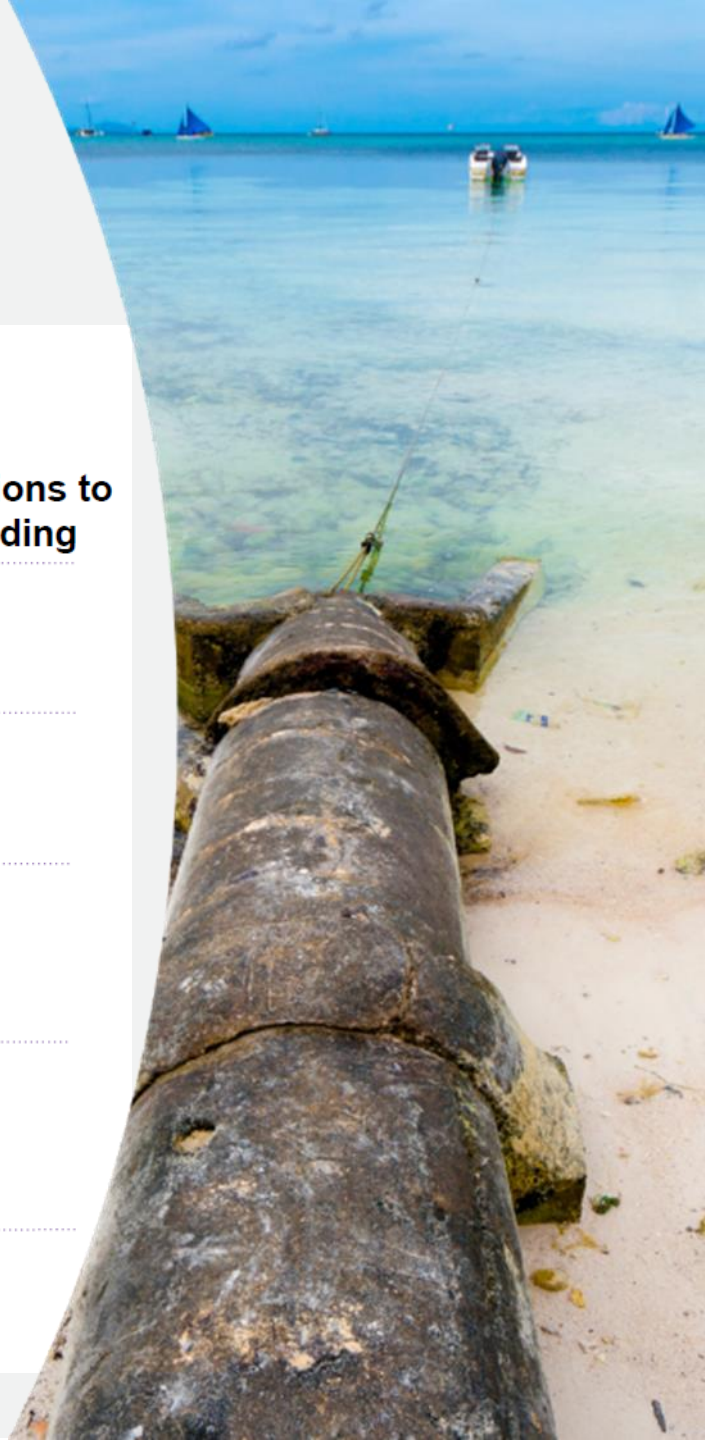

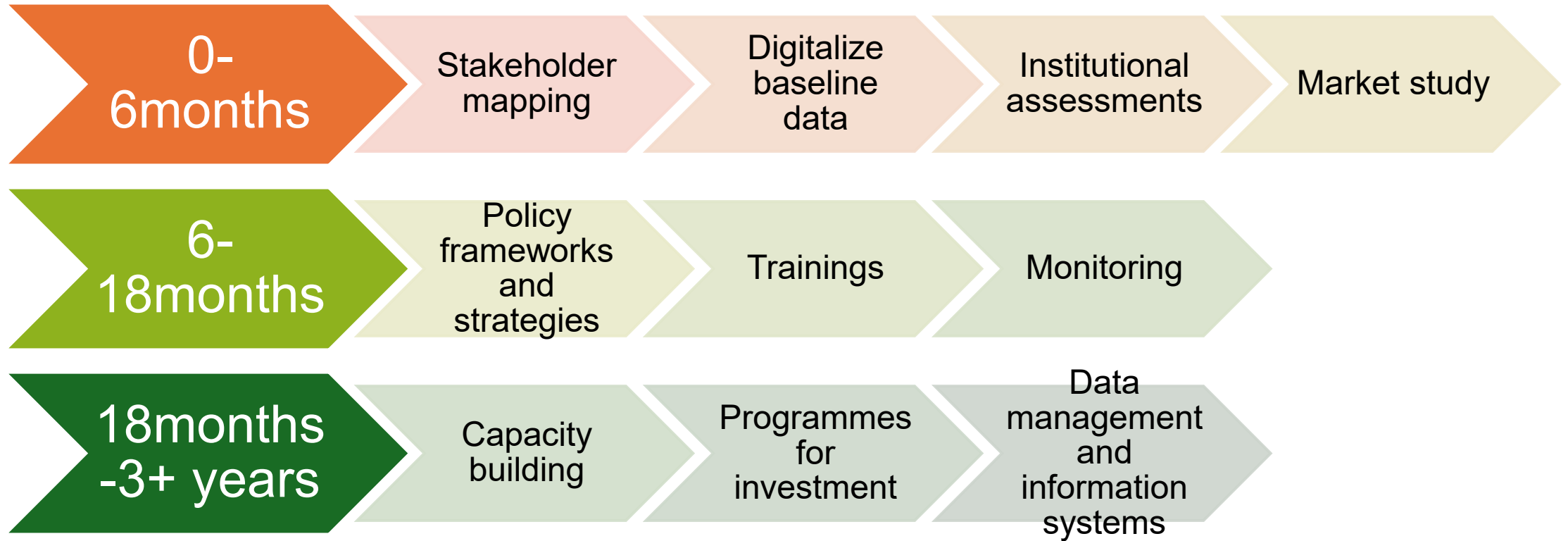

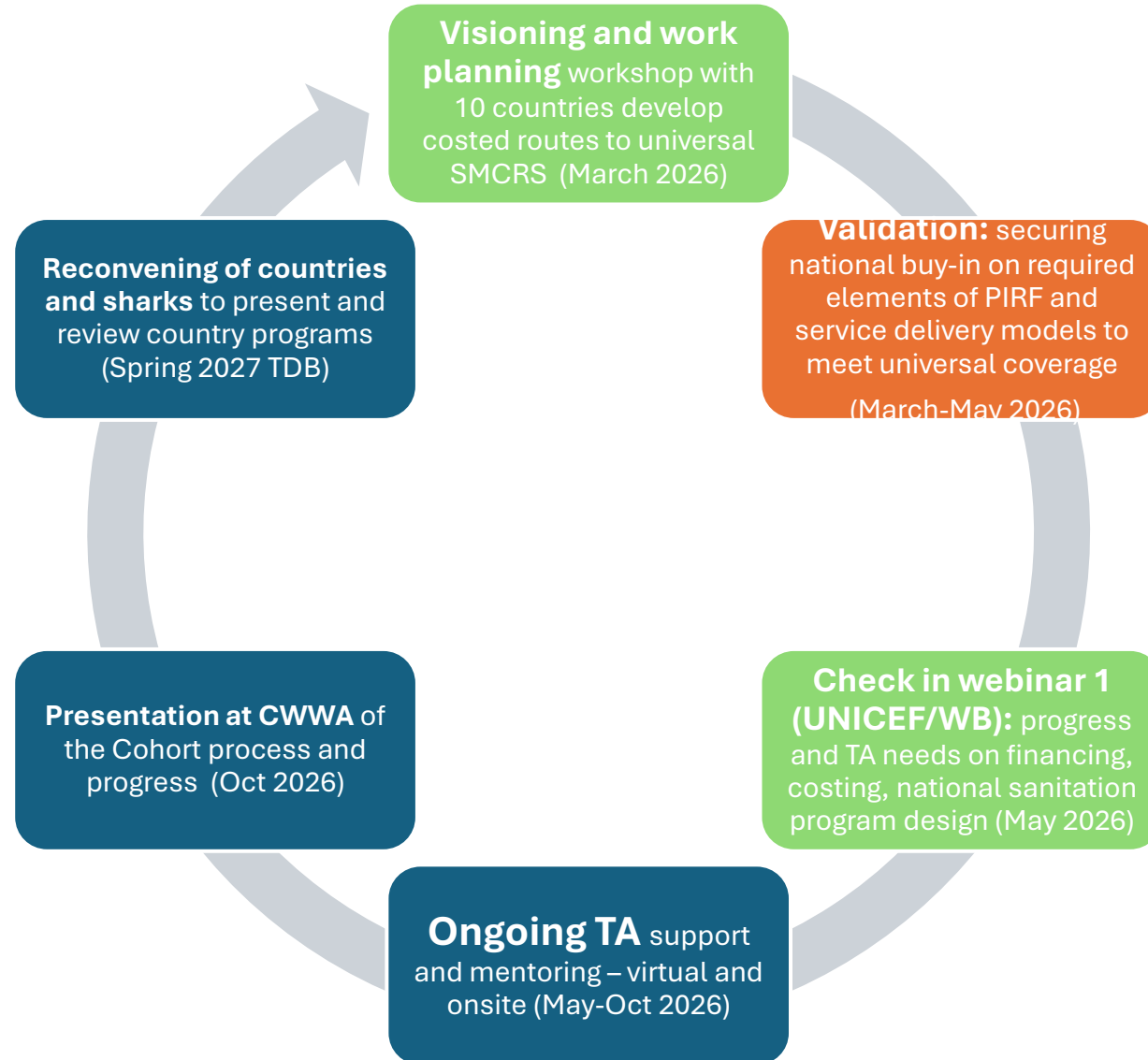
A clear roadmap with timelines developed
